SOCIAL JUSTICE COVID-19 FOOD AND TOILETRIES DRIVE

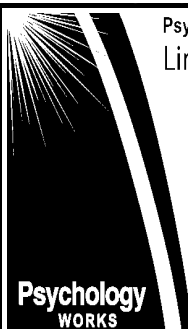
