THE PRAYER OF THE SINNER

Last Sunday's Gospel told of the determined struggle of a good person, a widow, for justice. Through this story Jesus teaches that God hears the persistent cries of the just. In today's Gospel it is a sinner who prays to God for mercy and, wonderfully, God hears the sinner's humble prayer also. The only prayer to which God cannot respond is that of the self-righteous who effectively say to God: 'I do not need you.'

SOME THOUGHTS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

- 'Which of these two people do I identify with?' is a common question after reading this passage. The answer is not straightforward! We can be both saint and sinner at different times.
- One went to the temple to praise himself, the other to praise God! One to ask for nothing, the other to ask for everything. God looks kindly on the humble heart, and leads us from pride to humility.
- To know oneself as a humble child of God, dependent on God for everything, is a grace to be asked for in prayer. It is a grace of God to know I need his mercy. Prayer is a time of relaxing into the merciful love of God, whose compassion and understanding of each of us is greater than we can ever know. I am loved not because I am good but because God is good.
- Am I honest with myself when I come before you, Lord? You read
 my poor heart. It is the real me whom you love, weaknesses and all.
 I pray for humility.

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

This Gospel really asks us to think about what constitutes right worship.

Is God impressed by words and outward show alone when the human heart is harbouring thoughts of hatred or vengeance? This parable would indicate that God is more impressed by humility and a recognition of our own need for healing.

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'
