GOSPEL REFLECTION

There are those who warn—on the basis of various apparitions—that God, offended by so much evil, is going to take a terrible vengeance on our world. This is highly dangerous language we must be careful to avoid. God does not take revenge. God is not hurt or offended by what we do. His is a never-changing love. He has nothing but compassion for the sinner who does not and cannot hurt God, but only hurts himself. In the language of today, God is totally proactive, not reactive! No one, says Jesus, not even he himself knows when the end will come:

But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven nor the Son, but only the Father.

It is not for us to worry about that. In fact, worrying will not help.

On the other hand, we should not play a kind of Russian roulette with life and keep putting off the day of our conversion to God. The only way is to live today and every day in his love and service. It is the present which determines the future—so let's just concentrate on the here and now. Then we already have entered the Lord's Kingdom and when, early or late, he comes to call us to himself, it will just be a reunion of old friends. In fact, God is already here—he always has been and always will be. It is not that he will come to us, but that we will enter into a deeper relationship with him when we pass through the *kairos* (Greek, 'the right or critical moment') of death to a different kind of life.
