



#### REMEMBER, AND BE GRATEFUL

This Sunday's Gospel reading offers a surprising contrast to the First Reading. We see how readily the ten lepers obeyed Jesus' instruction: "Go and show yourselves to the priests." Their immediate compliance differs significantly from Naaman the leper in the First Reading, who had initially fiercely resisted the Prophet Elisha's command (earlier in chapter 5) to wash in the Jordan River. This resistance to instructions is, in fact, a deeply ingrained part of human nature. When faced with an instruction, there is a natural, often subconscious, internal reaction that tells us our freedom is being challenged. Psychology refers to this immediate pushback as "reactance."

It is this very hurdle—this innate reluctance to surrender control—that makes the instant obedience of the ten lepers so profoundly exemplary of true faith and trust. They didn't wait for proof; they simply trusted the promise of Jesus and walked toward the priests, believing they would be healed along the way. Such an act is rooted in immense humility and trust in God.

Yet, as exemplary as their faith is, the behaviour of one of the ten stands out even more. Against all social and religious instincts, this man realised that expressing gratitude to Jesus was more urgent than getting certified "clean" by the priest. He turned back.

This beautiful act reminds us that the secret to lasting Christian joy is an attitude of gratitude. Humility and trust are great starting points for our walk of faith, but it's the constant act of being thankful for the blessings we've received, and those yet to come, that guides us toward true spiritual perfection. May we walk this faith journey with deep humility and unwavering trust, continually growing in our capacity for gratitude and Christian joy. *Fr Shinto*

Luke 17:11-19


